### 'ŌLELO HAWAI'I (Hawaiian Language) & TRANSLATIONS

## Thirteen letters are used in the Hawaiian language

Five vowels: A, E, I, O, U, and eight consonants: H, K, L, M, N, P, W, including the 'okina (')

# The 'Okina & the Kahakō (diacritical markings) are important because they can change the pronunciation and meaning of Hawaiian words

'Okina (oh-kee-nuh) = glottal stop (like the "catch" in your throat when you say, "uh-oh") Curves the same way as "c" Only placed before a vowel **Kahakō** (kuh-huh-KO) = macron Elongates a vowel Only placed over a vowel
